

The Artsy Tomato-2013 Garlic Listing

Porcelain- clean white wrappers and pinkish clove skin. Bulbs often have 4-7 cloves.. A good roasting garlic with long storage potential

Melody - Crisp white wrappers make way for a delicious medium hot porcelain. A delightful garlic to be enjoyed by the true garlic lover.

Romanian Red - A very flavourful medium/hot porcelain that grows very well. Romanian Red is listed in the Seeds of Diversity Canada catalogue of heritage varieties.

Leningrad - Leningrad is a medium/hot Porcelain. Leningrad has become a staple thanks to its excellent flavour, ease of growing and long storage life. Leningrad is listed in the Seeds of Diversity Canada catalogue of heritage varieties.

Magical - Nice, nutty medium strength porcelain.

Northern Quebec - Good strength, flavour, size and vigor. One of our hottest Porcelain's. Popular with growers because it grows so well under all conditions. Northern Québec is listed in the Seeds of Diversity Canada catalogue of heritage varieties.

Susan Delafield - Susan Delafield is one of our hottest and most flavourful Porcelains. It grows tall, produces large bulbs, and is more tolerant of wet conditions than most garlic varieties. Susan Delafield is listed in the Seeds of Diversity Canada catalogue of heritage varieties.

Georgian Fire - Georgian Fire has good flavour and is moderate to hot. Georgian Fire is listed in the Seeds of Diversity Canada catalogue of heritage varieties.

Polish Jenn – A large, beautiful and well-formed porcelain garlic similar to Northern White. Its flavor is deep and musky and it has a rich mellowness that sticks around for a long time. Good rich medium flavored long storing garlic.

Ukrainian Mavnic - a vigorously growing garlic that has a nice strong flavour. Ukrainian Mavniv is listed in the Seeds of Diversity Canada catalogue of heritage varieties

German Stiffneck - Its flavor is very strong and robust and sticks around for a long time.

German Extra Hardy - A very white garlic, but the clove wrappers are a dark red. A distinctive, moderately spicy flavor sets this garlic apart from the rest.

Mennonite – Nice large porcelain, clean lovely heated flavour.

Italian Porcelain - Large, easy-to-peel cloves. Excellent shelf life, usually up to 10 months. Great rich flavour in a large bulb with 5-7 cloves

Duchene – Large full porcelain variety. Lingering heat. Excellent variety

Music - A large, beautiful and well-formed porcelain garlic similar to Northern White. Its flavor is very rich and musky, strong and robust and sticks around for a while.

Floha - An exceptionally versatile garlic. Excellent baked flavor without being too hot raw. Origin Germany.

Newfoundland Tall – Robust garlic, delicious and universal.

Pretoro – Wonderful porcelain filled with flavour, heat and delight.

Moravia- The clove skins are mauve-rose, nicely blended with tan, and the bulb wrappers have shown us some subtle golden veining.

Fish Lake 3 - Big cloves and bulbs; good strength and taste. Fish Lake 3 is listed in the Seeds of Diversity Canada catalogue of heritage varieties.

Purple Stripe - *Attractive bulb wrappers with purple stripes. Bulbs contain 8-12 pink skinned cloves. Medium to long storage*

Red Rezan - Red Rezan is a vigorous, mid-sized Glazed Purple Stripe. Red Rezan is listed in the Seeds of Diversity Canada catalogue of heritage varieties.

Northern Siberian - clean, medium-to-strong flavored garlic will warm your soul on the coldest winter evening.

Chesnok Red - cooking garlic that holds shape and retains flavor after it is cooked. Large bulbs that average 9 to 10 easy to peel cloves. From Shvelisi, Republic of Georgia.

Gaia's Joy - The bulb and clove wrappers are more gently coloured than most Marbled Purple Stripes. Lovely flavour.

Central Siberian - Hot, spicy and full of flavour, grows milder in storage. Larger bulbs with a stunning rich burgundy-purple skin

Belarus - Attractive and a wonderful tasting hardnecks. It's easy to peel with 8-12 dark red-skin, crescent shaped cloves.

Duganski - A stunningly beautiful, purple stripe garlic with large bulbs and an amazing flavor that matches its looks and size. Purple outer wrappers protect the violet-tinged cloves that burst with a fiery flavor and mellow out with a pleasant aftertaste

Persian Star - Vivid clove colors. Outer bulb wrappers sometimes smooth white, but inner wrappers purple streaked. Red-tipped cloves with marbled streaks on whitish or yellow-brown background. Very pleasant flavor with a mild spicy zing.

Metechi - Medium heat with a nice aftertaste. Very dark colouring on clove skins - almost black at the base.

Rocambole - Tan wrappers with coppery veins and very light to very deep purple blushes. Bulbs contain 8-12 cloves with light brown skins. Short to medium storage, but rich garlic flavor.

Killarney Red -Killarney Red compares favorably with German Red and Spanish Roja. Killarney Red is listed In the Seeds of Diversity Canada catalogue of heritage varieties. Classic rich taste, outstanding flavour. Small to medium sized bulbs.

Korean Purple - Korean Purple has a typically hearty and delicious Rocambole flavour. It is a reliable producer. Korean Purple is listed In the Seeds of Diversity Canada catalogue of heritage varieties.

Newfoundland Heritage – Heritage garlic from Newfoundland. Delicious garlic taste with lingering soft heat.

Brown Rose - Very fat cloves with rose-brown blush. Average 6 cloves per bulb. Long storing.

Amish - With a very strong flavor, this Rocambole is hot and spicy and holds up well, even after cooking.

Alison's - A medium to hot Rocambole with a pleasant flavour. Alison's is listed in the Seeds of Diversity Canada catalogue of heritage varieties

Spicy Korean Red - Thin bulb wrappers that have a lot of purple and brown in them. Spicy hot and delicious with lingering flavour

Legacy - Found growing wild on a farm near Blyth, Ontario. This garlic is prized by eastern Europeans looking for red garlic. 7-12 cloves on average, with more than enough heat for most palates

Hungarian Kiss - Brought to Ontario by the Kiss (*Kish*) family, from Hungary. Clean heat, wonderful flavour.

Piterelli - The bulb is slightly squatter than Legacy, with more layers manifesting the purple colouring more pronounced and darker. Czech origin. Good heat.

Colorado Black - Colorado Black has a smooth taste with a medium bite. It is listed in the Seeds of Diversity Canada catalogue of heritage varieties

Brown Saxon - Said to have great storing quality and be very hot when eaten raw. Origin- Republic of Georgia.

Softneck - White wrappers sometimes with a purple blotch, average 8-15 cloves per bulb. Very long storage potential

Transylvanian - It originated in the heart of the Transylvania Mountains and has nice plump cloves. It has a hot garlic flavor. Average about 7 to 9 cloves per bulb.

Red Toch - This is a popular variety that was first collected in Rep. of Georgia near the town of Tochliavri. Clove wrappers are streaked with red and pink.

Lokalen - A spirited, strong garlic with a bit of a bite. Buff-colored wrappers engulf the short, squat bulbs, while hefty cloves are skinned in silken beige
